

From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. "The word of God came to Jonah," is a typical introduction to a divinely



inspired message to a prophet of Israel. A very important line in today's reading is omitted and that is that God's word came to him a second time. The first time, Jonah, the most reluctant prophet in all Israel, attempted to flee the divine commission, resulting in the well known story of Jonah in the belly of the whale. When, finally, Jonah goes to Nineveh, the people immediately repent. Again the reading omits the extent of their repentance. Their turning from evil moves God to turn away from the threat that Jonah proclaimed. The strangeness of Jonah's story gives scripture scholars a wide diversity of interpretation. Some see the whole book as a parable, rather than a historic narrative. Whatever its genre, the book has three very important theological messages: the power of God's Word, the universal call to repentance, and the vastness of God's compassion.

In the verses prior to today's reading, Paul writes to the church about how to live in the present age with the understanding that there will be an age to come. Throughout all of his letters, the church's belief in this future age underlies Paul's teaching. Today's text begins with his saying that the time until God's arrival to bring this new age to come is very short. Paul uses the Greek word kairos, for time, indicating the time designated by God, the appointed time of fulfilling God's promises. In the context of today's reading, the time refers to Christ's second coming. Yet Paul points out that we have already experienced God's kairos in the Incarnation. The Christ who will come in the future has already come among us. The things of the present age to which people cling are only a glimpse of the glory of the age to come.

Jesus' first words in Mark's gospel announce that the *kairos*, the appointed time of God's coming is now at hand. Immediately after announcing the

the appointed time, Jesus calls his first disciples. Simon, Andrew, James and John immediately respond to him, abandon their own way of life and enter into this new way of life.

Celebrant of our Masses this weekend is Father Jason Mitchell, a member of the faculty at Gannon University. I'm grateful for his willingness to cover the parish this weekend as I finish up rehab from having my right knee replaced. I will be back in the saddle next weekend.

I'm coming along really well after the surgery to replace my right knee. The initial therapy was a bit tough, but I survived and am now at home and getting around without a cane or anything. I must tell you that the absence of the pain that I've been experiencing is wonderful. I thank all of you for your care and concern.

The annual Catholic Services Appeal will get underway on the first weekend of February. This appeal raises funds for Catholic Charities, St. Martin's Center, funds the daily Bishop's Breakfast prepared for over 150 homeless people each day, etc. Each parish is assessed a set amount and anything raised above and beyond that remains in the parish. Last year our assessment was \$74,000 and we raised \$115,000 which meant that \$41,000 was able to remain here at St. Patrick's. Everyone will receive a letter from me within the next week or two and I'm hoping that you might be able to help support the appeal again this year. This year's assessment is slightly more at \$81,359.

St. Martin's Center does more to help the poor and those living on the margins of life than any other organization that I know. It helps people with food, clothing, rent, paying bills, etc. A number of our parishioners volunteer to help at the Center, and I'm wondering if there are any more of you who would be willing to volunteer. You can choose from a variety of tasks that need to be done and pretty much determine how many hours you would be able to commit to. Additional information is available by contacting the Center at 452-6113.

A recent study by the PEW Research Center on Orthodox Christians throughout the world shows

that they are experiencing a dramatic decline in numbers and participation. In Russia, only 6 percent of the Orthodox go to church, in Ukraine it is 12 percent and in Romania it is 21 percent. With the exception of Africa, India and the Philippines, Christianity is on a sharp decline throughout the world.

Canada's 17-month-old legalized euthanasia is aimed at an extensive expansion which would now allow euthanasia for teenagers and the mentally ill. In the first 12 months of enactment, over 2,000 Canadians died via medically prescribed poison injected into their veins. A poll also revealed that 70% of Canadian Catholics support the bill while 70% of evangelical Christians oppose it.

Pope Francis is asking bishops' conferences around the world for a translation change in the Lord's prayer. He says that the line, "and lead us not into temptation" is a bad translation. In France, the line was recently changed to "do not let us enter into temptation." "I am the one who falls. It's not God pushing me into temptation to then see how I have fallen," said the Holy Father. The Italian Bishops Conference is set to make the change soon and other nationalities are expected to do the same.

Your January packet of envelopes includes one to help with the costs of the Overflow Homeless Shelter which we will host for a week in February. This project costs the parish approximately \$6,000 for the week. Any help you can give to offset these expenses will be greatly appreciated.

We're going to have some dirt and mess in church over the next few months as the pipe organ is completely dismantled, repaired and then reconstructed. We'll do everything we can to keep it clean and then will do a thorough and complete clearing of the church once all of the work is finished.
