



From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple. Malachi, one of the last of the Hebrew prophets, wrote during the Persian



period, when the temple was rebuilt and worship resumed after the exile. The name Malachi means my messenger, and may either be the personal name of a prophet or a designation of his role to be God's messenger. His prophecy looks toward the day of the Lord when God will act as a powerful judge. The messenger that the Lord will send to prepare the way my be Malachi himself, Elijah, or another prophet. The messenger's unknow identity has led to a history of varied interpretations, with the New Testament ultimately seeing John the Baptist as the one preparing the way. He calls not only for reform of the abuses of worship but even more importantly, purification will entail reform of the conduct of priests and people alike. Only then will their sacrifices be pleasing to the Lord.

Today's reading from Hebrews presents Jesus as two distinct yet interrelated perspectives: he is both fully human and he is a high priest. He comes to save humanity from the devil and his power over the devil and over death itself frees his brothers and sisters from the fear of physical death at the end of life. This is so because Jesus is the source of life beyond death. From another angle, existence outside the faith community and alienation from God because of sin is tantamount of being dead. Jesus is portrayed as the perfect high priest, merciful and faithful, whose sacrifice expiated the sins of the people. His testing and suffering gave him a profound understanding of the experiences of his brothers and sisters.

When Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to the temple to present him to the Lord, they also present him to the world. Simeon is the first of Spirit-filled figures to present Jesus to both Jews and Gentiles. With the child in his arms, Simeon prays with a profound sense of peace. God had promised him he would not see death until he had seen God's anointed one, and now his eyes see God's salvation in the infant he holds. After such a joyful revelation, his words to Mary offer a

glimpse of future sorrow. He states that Jesus will be responsible for the fall and rise of many in Israel, foretelling the opposition he will face. As if to counterbalance Simeon's prophecy, Anna steps forward and give thanks for the child and speak of him to all awaiting redemption of Jerusalem, thereby presenting him to his people. The scene ends quietly with the family returning to Nazareth.

During the first week of January, I had 19 requests for a wedding date at St. Patrick's in the year 2021. Until the end of March we only take reservations from registered active parishioners. Then, if there are still any dates open, we will consider non-parishioners. Remember that all of our weddings at St. Patrick's are a wedding service, and not a wedding Mass.

We are insulating the attic in the rectory, something which was never done. It's a rather monumental project given the size of the house (there are 13,000 square feet in the rectory). We've talked about it for sometime but now are finally getting it done.

Our Food Pantry distributed 6,509 pounds of food during the month of December at a cost to the parish of \$356.55. Once again, all of these costs are covered by your generosity.

As I think you're aware, we tithe our Christmas and Easter collection and give ten percent of it to the poor. This year we were able to send Emmaus Soup Kitchen a check for \$1,000; St. Patrick's Haven a check for \$1,000 and St. Martin's Center a check for \$1,000. In addition to this, we send both Emmaus Soup Kitchen and St. Patrick's Haven \$100 each month.

There has been a sharp rise of attacks on Catholic places in Europe during the last two years. The highest level of the violence has been in France where an average of three sites every day are coming under attack. In Germany, the attacks are occurring on an average of two times every day. The acts take a variety of forms, including arson, urination and defecation, desecration, looting and even Satanism. Though there is no evidence that Muslims are involved in the violence, a rise of resistance to immigrants from Muslim countries is being fueled by the attacks. Police recently launched an investigation after windows were smashed at St. Thomas Church in Leipzig, Germany, the burial place of composer

Johann Sebastian Bach, on New Year's Eve.
Two several hundred year stained glass windows
were destroyed and more than 20 Art Nouveau
panes were also destroyed. During the attack,
heavy stones were thrown into the building.

Many of you have told me that you can hear much better with the improvements we have made to the sound system. That upgrade cost approximately \$10,000 and we still have more work to do. The company who did the work tell me that the system is 16 years old and one of these days one of the speakers will go and will have to be replaced. When that happens, they tell me we'll have to replace both speakers. We'll just keep on top of it and do what has to be done. I can tell you that with the improvements they made to the system, for the first time I can hear in the sanctuary. The speakers are outside the sanctuary and I haven't been able to hear the readings, etc., but now I can.

The Archdiocese of New York is opening several shuttered churches as homeless shelters which will provide beds for 1,000 homeless people. Last year the archdiocese confirmed plans to build a 200-family, most women and children homeless shelter in addition to a 22-bed all-female shelter owned by Catholic Charities. Former convents, rectories and churches that are selected will be renovated before they house people. The shelters are all located on Staten Island and many of the homeless from that area have moved into mid -town Manhattan to live on the streets. Part of the idea is to return them to the boroughs in which they properly belong. The city of New York has plans to build 90 homeless shelters across the five boroughs over the next five years.

St. Patrick's week of the Overflow Homeless Shelter is presently underway. As you know, we rent the Social Center from the Church of the Nativity to house the event. We are taking in approximately 60—70 homeless people each night, providing them with a hot meal, a shower, a chance to relax and watch TV and then a warm bed. Thank you for your support of this project.







LENTEN PRACTICES 2020

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednes-

day, February 26, 2020, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening, April 9, 2020.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2020. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish.

- 1. Traditional Lenten practices of **PRAYER**, **FAST-ING**, and **ALSMGIVING**, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2. ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.
- 3. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
