



From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our gospel we hear Jesus' invitation: "Be merciful as your Father is



merciful." An example of such compassion is David. King Saul, consumed by jealousy of David's rising popularity, has driven the youth from court and pursues him in the Judean desert. Given the opportunity, David refuses to take revenge. One night he and Abishai enter unimpeded into the king's camp and find Saul and Abner, the military general, asleep and unquarded. Abishai proposes to kill Saul. David stops him and instead steals the insignia of his royal person to prove that he had the opportunity to kill Saul but declined. David was compassionate toward an unjust persecutor, showing mercy. David adds, "The Lord will reward every person according to the terms of righteousness and faithfulness," words that foreshadow how David will succeed Saul.

Paul writes that just as we resemble Adam, made from the earth, so also we resemble Christ and are formed in his image. Like Adam, we are fashioned according to God's image, but we also inherit Adam's weakness. Through Baptism, however, we bear the imprint of Christ, share in his resurrection and receive from God the gift of his life-giving spirit.

In this gospel passage, often called the Discourse on the Plain, Jesus formulates the ethics of the reign of God, emphasizing the forgiveness and love for one's enemies. Jesus wants his disciples to conduct ourselves according to the divine essence: "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." That God is good to the deserving does not surprise us. That the Son of God would die for a righteous person is understandable. That our heavenly Father makes the sun rise on the worth, who could object? But that God shows goodness and mercy to the rude, the mean, the swindler, the wicked, that his Son would die for people while they are sinners, that God shines the same sun on those who love him and those who despise him, that is more than we can

fathom. According to secular criteria, God's governance is not just. Equity, equality, democracy and leadership are measured by a different value system in God's reign. Jesus tells us how a wasteful son squandered his inheritance and how his responsible brother fulfilled all his duties, yet the father did not reward and punish each one as we might expect. What is amazing about the gospel, is not that we see these things in God, but that Jesus expects us to act in the same manner. "For the measure in which you measure will in return be measured out to you." The call is to leave resentment and vengeance behind.

The Sisters of St. Joseph recently made a gift of \$1,500 to our parish Food Pantry. We're all grateful for their generosity. Sister Mary Pascal, who started the Food Pantry and after whom it is named, was a Sister of St. Joseph. And those same sisters had a presence in St. Patrick's Parish from the 1870s when they first staffed the parish school until just two years ago when Sister Marie Kebort retired. We owe this community of women a great deal of gratitude.

A new report shows that Europe is facing a "faith drain." Europe is now home to just 24 percent of the world's Catholics, compared to 65 percent in 1910. As of 2015, that number stood at 267 million, second only to South America with 335 million. Latin America now boasts 39 percent of the global Catholic population, while Africa is tipped to dominate in terms of body count shortly after 2030. Some 16 percent of people in Sub-Saharan Africa identify as Catholic and 12 percent do the same in Asia-Pacific. Catholics in Poland number 87 percent of the population, Italy 78 percent and Portugal 77 percent. Catholics in these areas were described as more religious. but also much more socially conservative, for example opposing gay marriage and legal abortion. The study also reveals that Catholics in Western Europe, aside from the three countries named above, are more accepting of Muslim, such as accepting a Muslim as a family member.

Peter Steinfels is a high respected and retired religion editor of the *New York Times*. He recently penned a lengthy article for *Commonweal* on the PA Grand Jury report in which he writes, "the document is inaccurate, unfair and misleading."

He notes that the report makes two distinct charges. The first concerns predator priests, their many victims and their unspeakable acts. That charge is, as far as can be determined, dreadfully true. It is in the second charge that he takes a dramatic stance. "All of these victims were brushed aside, in every part of the state, by church leaders who preferred to protect the abusers and their institutions above all." Or as the introduction to the report sums it up, "Priests were raping little boys and girls, and the men of God who were responsible for them not only did nothing; they hid it all."

Steinfels contends that the report does not document the sensational charges contained in its introduction—namely, that over seven decades Catholic authorities, in virtual lockstep, supposedly brushed aside all victims and did absolutely nothing in the face of terrible crimes, except to conceal them. Steinfels writes, "This ugly, indiscriminate and inflammatory charge, unsubstantiated by the report's own evidence, to say nothing of the evidence the report ignores, is truly unworthy of a judicial body responsible for impartial justice."

In 2002, the American bishops issued the Dallas Charter which set down zero tolerance guidelines for handling sex abuse by clergy or laity. Steinfels writes that the "Dallas Charter has worked. Not worked perfectly, not without need for regular improvements....but worked. It set out and has regularly fine-tuned, procedures, practices and standards that can be overseen by middling caretaker leaders." He points out strongly how former Erie bishop Donald Trautman was misrepresented in the report and shows that he did nothing to dissuade people from taking sex-abuse charges to the police.

Life is short, so drink the good wine first. I had it all. I talked with a homeless man this morning and asked him how he ended up this way. He said, "Up until last week, I still had it all. I had plenty to eat, my clothes were washed and pressed, I had a roof over my head, I had HDTV and internet, and I went to the gym, the pool and the library. I was working on my MBA on-line. I had no bills and no debt. I even had full medical coverage." I felt sorry for him, so I asked, "What happened? Drugs? Alcohol? Divorce?" "Oh, nothing like that," he replied. "I was paroled.."
