


From
the
Pastor's
Desk...

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent. With today's first reading, the Book of Genesis begins a lengthy series of epi-



sodes concerning Abram, considered the father of God's people and supreme model of faith. In Genesis 17:5, God changes Abram's name to Abraham. In biblical thought, a new name signifies a change in one's identity, character or role. Abram is renamed when God assures him that the promises made in today's Scripture will be fulfilled. The terminology is *bless*, and *blessing* in this passage is very important. It appears over six hundred times in the Old Testament. The Hebrew word that is used conveys a sense of God supplying strength to do what lies beyond human capacity. In blessing Abram, the Lord assures him that divine power will supply what human weakness cannot accomplish.

Today's brief second reading comes from Second Timothy, one of the three letters called the Pastoral Epistles: First and Second Timothy and Titus. Though attributed to Paul, they are believed to date from the early second century, written by an unknown disciple of Paul or the Pauline school. These three writings are so named because they address practical matters of life in early Christian communities facing adversity, false teaching the opposing values of the prevailing culture.

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Lent, the Church presents a narrative of Jesus' Transfiguration. Mt, Mk & Lk have this narrative but each with subtle differences because each address a different community. Matthew's hearers seem to be struggling with various questions about the continuity of discontinuity between Jesus and the Judaism of their birth. As such, Mt frequently strives to show that Jesus fulfills or brings to completion the Old Testament scriptures. His treatment of the Transfiguration emphasizes the revelation of God in Jesus, who both epitomizes and transcends all previous disclosure of God in Israel's history.

From the Pastor's Desk continued......

Just prior to today's reading, Matthew has Jesus teaching on the mountain, a setting that recalls God's gift of the Torah to Moses on Mt. Sinai. Mt thus portrays Jesus as true interpreter of the Law of Moses. The Law and Prophets are fulfilled, symbolized by the figures of Moses and Elijah. The bright cloud reminds us of the guiding presence of God as a pillar of cloud in Israel's desert journey. Mt alone adds: listen to him," a frequent OT admonition.

At a recent Parish Council meeting, a resolution was passed which says that St. Patrick's Parish will gladly celebrate funerals for non-parishioners but we will not schedule them more than three days in advance. The reason for this is that 75% of our funerals are non-parishioners and families often request a date two or three weeks in advance so that out of town family can be here. What is happening, however, is that a parishioner dies and they want a funeral in 3 days and it's already booked by a non-parishioner. By limiting the time this way, we're protecting you who are parishioners.

All parishioners have received a letter from me concerning the 2017 Catholic Services Appeal. This annual drive is the largest source of income for the diocese and funds a wide variety of charitable projects. Each parish is assessed a set amount based on income and any money raised above that remains in the parish. Our assessment this year is \$74,000, and I'm hoping we can reach a goal of \$100,000 so that I will have funds toward the restoration of the pipe organ. All I ask is that you consider your situation and give whatever you feel you can give. Nothing more.

The final Lenten Scripture class will be offered on Monday at 10 AM and again at 6 PM.

Though the Fridays of Lent are to be observed as days when we abstain from eating meat, Bishop Persico has dispensed the diocese from that obligation for this Friday, March 17, the feast of St. Patrick.

In the 1600s, Paulander monks in Bavaria were a very strict order who did not eat any solid food during Lent. They needed more than water for sustenance, so all they did for Lent was drink

beer!! They concocted an "unusually strong" brew full of carbohydrates and nutrients, because liquid bread wouldn't break the fast!!!"

Pope Francis spoke recently on how the political community, civil society and the church ought to react to the phenomenon of mass migration, especially forced migration. "Unfortunately, in the majority of cases this movement is forced, caused by conflict, natural disasters, persecution. climate change, violence, extreme poverty and inhumane living conditions," he said. The proper response to migration, the pope said is fourfold: "to welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate." In the face of a climate of rejection of migrants "rooted ultimately in self-centeredness and amplified by populist rhetoric, what is needed is a change of attitude, to overcome indifferences and to counter fears with a generous approach of welcoming those who knock at our doors," he said.

Over 60,000 people received ashes at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City on Ash Wednesday!!! By the time the day was over, I felt I had distributed almost as many here!!!

All of our ongoing parish volunteers and their spouses gathered at Gannon University on Mardi Gras for a cocktail party both to say thanks to everyone for their participation in the parish and to help introduce ourselves to one another. In my invitation, I asked everyone to introduce themselves to three parishioners whom they do not know and it seems everyone did that.

Jesus, Moses and an old man go golfing. The first one to tee off is Moses. He smashes the ball and it is heading right for the water hazard before the green. Moses raises his club, the water parts and the ball makes it to the green. Jesus swings and his ball is headed for the water. He closes his eyes and prays. The ball skips across the water and lands on the green, two feet from the hole. The old man's turn comes and he drives the ball. The ball looks like it is going directly to the water. A fish jumps from the water swallowing the ball, as an eagle drops from the sky, grabbing the fish. As the eagle flies over the green, a bolt of lightning strikes the bird, making it drop the fish. As the fish hits the green, it spits out the ball and the ball falls into the hole, making a hole in one. Jesus turns to Moses and says, "Next time I'm leaving dad at home."






