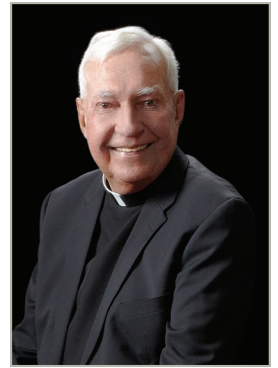

From the Pastor's Desk...



Today is the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. God's Spirit, literally wind or breath, enables the prophet to hear God's Word. He cannot rise of his own volition; the Spirit enters and sets him on his feet. "I am sending you....and you shall say to them....they shall know..." words that express the essential elements of the prophetic call. The Israelites are "hard of face and obstinate of heart." Whether the "rebellious house" listens or not, "they shall know that a prophet has been among them. Ezekiel's success does not depend on his audience's reaction, but on his obedient proclamation of God's Word. Israel will know that Ezekiel is God's spokesperson only when the prophecies have been fulfilled. Sending the prophet shows God's concern and involvement in Israel's life, despite her chronic sin and obstinacy.

After his testimony of a mystical experience, Paul confesses the "thorn in the flesh" that was given to keep him from becoming too elated by such a revelation. The thorn is variously interpreted as a sickness or physical disability like epilepsy, depression, headaches or eye problems. It might be a persistent temptation or handicap connected with his personal life. Its elusive identity makes it applicable to any reader. Paul appeals three times for its removal, like Jesus in Gethsemane, a sign of how intolerable he felt the thorn to be. His petition is denied; relief is withheld for a higher purpose. Paul's request that it be removed credits God with the power to remove it, but the denial helps Paul understand the relationship of power and weakness. Romans stresses over and over that as much as sin may abound, God's grace abounds even more.

"The brother of James..." in Semitic usage, the terms "brother" or "sister" are applied to nephews, nieces, cousins, as well as to children of the same parent, a usage which is present in the Greek translation of the New Testament. Today's gospel shows how Jesus' healing power could not take effect in Nazareth because of their lack

of faith. We're told he healed some people there, an obvious reference to the fact that these people had faith in his power to heal.

Our Irish Festival will be here before we know it. (September 14, 15 & 16) and a lot of work is already well underway. The group who staff the booth for baked goods already have freezers full of goodies, the group working on the jewelry booth have a room full of items on the second floor of the rectory as well as a wide assortment of purses, etc. Eric Albright, chair for this coming year, is working closely with Gary and Becky Johnson (chairs the past two years) as they have graciously agreed to help walk him through his first year as the new chairperson. We have already secured a grant from the Gaming Authority to help with the project, all of the licenses needed by the city and state have been approved, etc. Since moving the festival to the neighborhood around the church, we've seen a significant increase in the number of people who attend, and there is every indication that will continue particularly as this lower eastside is rejuvenated.

The former Saint Mary's Church and rectory on East Ninth Street have been sold to another religious congregation who are using the church for worship and the rectory to house women being released from prison, along with their children, and helping these women get on their feet and get a job to support their family.

When our pipe organ was built and installed in 1906, one section of pipes was not included. The pipe organ at St. Andrew's Church hasn't been functional in forty years and most likely never will be again. That pipe organ has that section of pipes and Organ Supply has determined that they will fit in our pipe organ. We have made an offer to St. Andrew's to purchase those and install them, and are waiting to hear from them. Morgan Jacox, the donor who is graciously underwriting the \$432,000 cost of the restoration, has also come to me and offered to pay for this additional installation. Hopefully we will see it come to fruition.

In October we will host a wedding anniversary celebration for couples observing their 60th, 50th, 40th, 25th and 10th wedding anniversaries. We

will invite the couples to gather in church where they will all renew their vows. Following that, we will invite them to the rectory for a cocktail party. We did this last year for couples celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary, and it was very well received so we're going to try to make it an annual event.

I mentioned recently that we have to replace all of the main entrance doors to the church. They are 115 years old and we're having a tough time opening them and securing them. I had people here to look at them and they tell me they are beyond repair. We have ordered new doors and they should be here by early August at the earliest. We are changing the style of the doors rather dramatically and going with an all glass door which will be much lighter in weight and much more attractive.

Congratulations to parishioner Ryan Atzert who has been identified by *Erie Reader* as one of the 40 under 40. These are people whom the paper has identified because of their leadership skills and because they are making a difference in Erie. Ryan and his wife Autumn, opened Federal Hill Smokehouse which has received the award as "Best New Business" for the Erie Best Awards. It has also been identified as the "Best Place to get Barbeque in Erie."

The working document for the upcoming Synod on the family says that "sexuality, the role of women and the desire for a Church that listens are among the main concerns of young people." It says that young people are living in a time of increased cultural instability, and are divided over Church teaching on contraception, homosexuality, abortion and marriage. The document notes that many young people do not follow the directions of the sexual morality of the church. Several national conferences of bishops said sexuality should be discussed more openly.

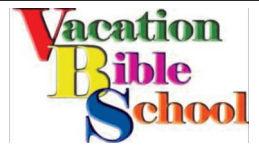
Joy Ministries to host outdoor music/praise event

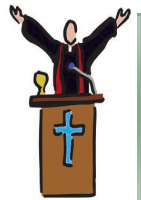
Vacation Bible School—
