### *From the Pastor's Desk.....*

Today is the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our first reading, Abraham fusses over his visitors; in our gospel, Martha will do the same. Yet she is corrected, while Abraham receives the promise of a son. The difference is that Abraham is fully focused on his visitors. In a sense, he plays both Martha and Mary because he even stands by his visitors as they dine to be attentive to every need. He is aware that he is hosting divine visitors. Sarah is told to knead half a bushel of flour while the servants slaughter and prepare a tender calf. But more than feeding them, he opens himself to hear their word. Busyness that prevents real focus on the other is not true hospitality.

Our Catholic tradition espouses a unique understanding of suffering that enables us to see it as a participation in the suffering of Christ. From that perspective, suffering itself is "redeemed" because instead of being something totally negative, it becomes a way that all of us can share in Christ's redemptive suffering. Further in our tradition, that suffering continues throughout time in his body which is us, the church. Remember Paul is in jail as he writes this letter to the Colossians but he knows that he shares in Christ's suffering for the sake of the church. Christ and Christians form one body; we suffer together and we are redeemed together.

Jesus often visited at the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Martha assumes the role of host as she welcomes Jesus. Luke is making a point that a requirement of discipleship is to listen. Jesus is not about to reject the meal Martha is preparing but he rejects her anxiety and worry. While she prepares a meal, Jesus shares his message and in her busyness she is missing it. Mary, on the other hand, has assumed the posture of a disciple, sitting at the feet of the Lord and listening

to what he is saying. Mary breaks a double taboo. She leaves the kitchen and she sits at the feet of the rabbi, a spot reserved only for men. Recall that Luke's Jesus is more attentive to women than any of the other gospel portraits of him. And, finally, discipleship requires focus. Mary is focused; Martha is not. Ecclesiastes says there is a time for everything—time to prepare a meal and time to listen.

Mark your calendars. Erie Gives Day is Tuesday, August 9. Any contribution made to St. Patrick's Church that day will share in a fund created by GE and the Erie Community Foundation. You can make an offertory contribution, Catholic Services Appeal, festival, etc. Last year, St. Patrick's received more contributions than any other church in the city. Let's do it again!!!

A study by the Benedict XVI Center for Religious Studies in England has found that 48% of adults in England and Wales identify themselves as having no religion. 19.8% identify themselves as Anglican, 8.3% as Catholic, 4.4% as Muslim and 3.3% as members of another non-Christian religion. In 1983, 44.5% identified themselves as Anglican and 8.2% as Catholic. Among the Christian denominations in those two countries, Catholicism has the strongest retention rate (55.8%) and the youngest cohort of people. At the same time, 28.5% say they attend Mass weekly, while nearly 60% of cradle Catholics say they rarely or never attend Mass. Two-thirds of all weekly or more Mass goers are women.

The Diocese of Erie is currently compiling and studying the results of feedback, etc. on the draft of a parish restructuring plan that was presented to parishes this past February. Deadline for feedback was May 31. In September the diocese will announce the final plan which will be a combination of the original proposal as well as incorporating rational feedback. The new configuration of

parishes will take effect Feb. 17, 2017. St. Patrick's will continue as a "stand alone parish," while St. Hedwig's will be merged into another parish. The original proposal was to merge it into Mother of Sorrows (the former St. Ann's, St. Casimir's and Holy Family parishes.) The parishioners at St. Hedwig's, in compiling their feedback, asked instead that they be merged into St. Stanislaus parish.

Each year every Catholic parish must host a missionary to expand our understanding of the missionary work of the church and also to participate in that work through our contributions. This year we have been assigned the Vincentian Fathers who work in India. A priest from the congregation will be at St. Hedwig's and St. Patrick's next weekend to speak at all of the Masses. A second collection will then be taken up for their work.

We were unable this past week to record the homily which is usually placed on our web page. It did not record because of interference from cell phones being on in church. Can I ask that you turn all cell phones off when entering the church. Thank you.

A homeless person was asking people for money as they came into church this past weekend. Can I ask that you please not give them any money. We have programs in place to care for their every need. What you give them goes to drugs and alcohol
