### From the Pastor's Desk.....

Today is the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Each Sunday's first reading sets the stage for the gospel by introducing the theme that lies at the center of the gospel text. Preparedness is today's theme. In the gospel, the message is sobering; but the reading from Wisdom celebrates Israel's readiness for the Exodus. For centuries, Israelites languished in Egypt as slaves. All the while, they clung to the promise God made to their ancestors. Despite the length of time, the people put their faith in God believing he would be faithful. Moses enters the history of the Jewish people in a strange way. He has lived in the royal court as a prince of Egypt and has no other claim to the Israelites than the fact that God sent him to deliver them. Because of the faith they had cultivated during their years of waiting, the people recognized God's messenger. Today we hear of the plague which took the firstborn of every Egyptian family, but spared the Israelites.

Our second reading is one of the finest texts in all of the scriptures. It is about faith, about trusting that God would save them in the face of great adversity. With faith, their hearts and eyes were able to see what God had promised but was not yet fulfilled. Faith is the evidence of things not seen. It is about the "not yet," the "hoped for," the "promise," and the "dream."

We read the familiar story of the bridesmaids who are unprepared, a stark reminder to each of us that we know not the day nor the hour when the Lord will call us home. Preparedness is a key component of our faith. Note the pastoral tone in Jesus's voice today. He calls them "little flock," and tells them, "Do not be afraid," the most commonly repeated phrase in all of the scriptures, repeated most often in Luke. In Jesus' day, weddings were affairs that could last a week or more. Jesus is adamant in praising the servant who is

### prepared.

I will be on retreat this week at Christ the King Seminary in Buffalo. Retreat ends on Thursday. There are 17 of us on this retreat. I remember as a young priest there would be 80 to 90 of us on a retreat. Times have changed.

We have offered several European river cruises in the past. In October 2017, we will be offering a river cruise called "Cities of Light." The trip is a bit longer than our norm with a total of 12 nights and will go from Prague to Paris. Among highlights will be 2 nights in Prague; a day visiting Nuremberg, Germany where we will see the courtroom from the trials; a day in Luxemburg which will include a visit to the American Cemetery where General George Patton is buried; and two days in Paris. We also have a May trip to Spain, to Barcelona, Madrid & Seville. If anyone is interested in information about the trip, please call the parish office and leave us your e-mail.

Our maintenance staff have completed work on the roof over the weekday chapel. That roof is tin, and I had no idea what terrible shape it was in. To convince me to do the work, the maintenance staff took pictures of the roof, and I was shocked at how it had deteriorated. At any rate, they sanded, cleaned, painted and now it looks wonderful and should be secure for years. With hundred

year old buildings, it is never ending.

Speaking of buildings, unfortunately a pipe burst in the rectory at St. Hedwig's recently. Our maintenance man goes into those buildings every day to check on them, and I'm grateful he does. Despite that, it did a lot of water damage to the flooring of the first floor bathroom where it burst. Both the church and the rectory buildings at St. Hedwig's are deteriorating. The windows in both buildings are in terrible shape. Some of the stained glass in church is badly buckled and needs to be re-leaded; the windows in the rectory are in worse shape and need to be completely replaced. It would be impossible to live in that rectory in the winter with the windows in the condition they are in. In addition, there are serious problems with the boiler as well as some roofing problems. There simply isn't the money.

Have you ever thought of remembering your parish in your estate planning? You can name a parish as beneficiary of a life insurance policy or you can make a specific bequest to a parish. At St. Patrick's we have a foundation solely for maintenance of the church.

Sister Marie Stephen Kebort, SSJ prays "The Daily Examen of St. Ignatius" every day. It helps her focus on the joy and challenges of her life.

"You cannot give to others and neglect your own spiritual life," she says. "You need to be a reservoir – not a channel – or you will have nothing to share with others."

Born in Meadville, Sister Marie Stephen entered the Sisters of St. Joseph from St. Brigid Parish on August 29, 1956 and professed her final vows on August 15, 1964.

She credits her parents and the Sisters of St. Joseph at St. Brigid School and at Spencer Hospital, both in Meadville, for inspiring her call to religious life.

For nearly 40 years she taught in several diocesan elementary schools: St. Andrew, Villa Maria Elementary, St. John the Baptist, Blessed Sacrament and St. Paul, all in Erie; Holy Rosary in Johnsonburg; St Leo in Ridgway; and St. Francis in Clearfield.

From 1977-84, she served as principal at St. Andrew School, Erie. For ten years she taught at Holy Trinity School in Byesville, Ohio, and then worked in high school religious education at SS. Peter and Paul Parish in Lore City, Ohio.

She came to St. Patrick's Parish in 1994 as director of religious education but since then has worn a multitude of hats. She participates in the Eastside Catholic Faith Formation program, directs the RCIA program at St. Patrick's, is the docent for the many tours of St. Patrick's Church, gives individual baptismal classes to new parents wanting to have their baby baptized; researches the parish records which date to 1837 as people search their genealogy; records all of the sacramental records at the parish; and the list could go on and on.

St. Patrick's has been incredibly blessed by her presence.
